Course Name		Foundations of Art			
Course Description		This course provides students with the knowledge and opportunity to explore an art form and to create individual works of art. The course covers the language, materials, and processes of a particular art form and the design elements and principles supporting a work of art. Although this course focuses on creation, it may also include the study of major artists, art movements, and styles. Foundations of Art offers a solid preparation for experienced art students and a non-threatening experience for the non-art major. The class teaches visual design and thinking in a variety of disciplines: Drawing/Painting, Pottery, Jewelry and Digital Photography. As a survey course, this class will enable the student to make informed choices in selecting additional art courses for continued study. For students in the Visual Arts Pathway, this class provides the framework for building a capstone portfolio and gallery show to take place during their senior year.

General Expectations

- Grades are based upon the demonstration of proficiency on units associated with a standard given during each formative or summative assessment. Formative grades in addition to summative unit assessments will be used to holistically determine the grade.
- Summative: 80% Summative measures of achievement are taken when unit master is expected. (i.e., unit tests, culmination of a project, embedded assessments, etc.)



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• Formative: 20% Formative assessments measure the scaffolding skills and/or content embedded in the unit. Formative assessments are taken frequently, after a student has practiced a skill or become familiar with content. Examples of formative assessments include but are not limited to exit tickets, paragraphs, oral check for understanding, warm-ups, stages in a large project, etc.

- Assessments will be graded based on teacher/district/state rubrics.
- On group projects, students will receive a grade for individual work and a group grade.
- Grades are based on achievement of Content Standards and Grade Level Expectations.
